GAMMA PHI WINS SISSON AWARD



Much credit goes to the rush team of Matt Titus ('99 Jenks), Sam Eiser ('99 Marlow), Jeff Elder ('99 Norman) and Ryan Kolkmann ('99 Broken Arrow). The rush team and other supporting members of Gamma Phi worked tirelessly throughout the summer to rush as many prospects as possible. Many of the signees are the direct product of the rush team's early contact with rushees around the state during the summer and persistent rush of those rushees through rush week. Referrals from alumni also played a key role in the signing of several rushees.

As always, there were disappointments. For instance, the Chapter missed out on two Beta sons, including one whom the Rush team did not even learn about until the middle of rush week. (The moral: Summer rush is critical; tell us about prospective legacies *early*!)

The Chapter was also unable to realize its goal of a 50-man pledge class. The number of rush registrants during fall rush OU's 20+ was again low. fraternities competed for a pool of only 472 rushees. According to IFC, only 419 rushees ended up pledging with a fraternity. Consequently, Gamma Phi's 32man pledge class is a significant accomplishment. Alumni should know that the Chapter had the opportunity to sign significantly more than 32 pledges, but doing so would have required have compromising Gamma Phi's standards regarding academics and character. The Chapter elected to maintain its standards.
