GAMMA PHI CELEBRATES ITS CENTENNIAL

One Hundred Years of Excellence ---Past Achievements and Future Promise ...

Over seven hundred Beta Theta Pi alumni, actives, pledges and their guests gathered October 20, 2007, at the McCasland Field House on the campus of the University of Oklahoma to celebrate the Centennial of the establishment of the Gamma Phi Chapter of Beta Theta Pi at the University on October 18, 1907. The chapter began as a local fraternity in February 1904 and is the oldest fraternity at the University. Coincidently, the State of Oklahoma also celebrated its Centennial in 2007, having become a state on November 22, 1907. Thus, Gamma Phi is the only Beta chapter that was granted its charter at a pre-statehood institution.

With more than 150 current active members and 50 pledges, Gamma Phi is the largest chap-

ter in the General Fraternity. The chapter house at 800 Chautauqua was built by chapter alumni in the late 1920s and, except for a period during World War II, has been continuously occupied by the active members. In 1982 the chapter house was placed on the National Register of Historic Places --- one of the first Greek houses in the nation to be so designated. The chapter has enjoyed substantial success throughout much of its history both on the campus of the University of Oklahoma and among all Beta Theta Pi chapters.

Planning for this once-in-a-lifetime event began over three years ago. Several pledge classes held gatherings prior to the Saturday-night Gala. Rich Taylor, *Oklahoma* '71, Chair of the Weitzenhoffer Department of Musical Theatre, served as Master of Ceremonies for the Gala. (Continued on page 4)





Norman Transcript October 24, 1907

GAMMA PHI INSTALLED.

Lage Number of Betas Attend Installation and K. U. Game Banquet at Oklahoma City.

Fifty-five members of the Beta Theta Pi fraternity representing colleges in almost every section of the country arrived in Norman Thursday and Friday to participate in the installation of the local Gamma Phi chapter.

Friday afternoon the visiting Betas were shown through the University and about the city.

That evening the members of the Gamma Phi were initiated into the Beta Theta Pi fraternity by the Kansas chapter, assisted by other Betas who have been out of school for a number of years. The installation was very successful and the most auspicious in the history of the Beta Theta Pi fraternity.

Saturday afternoon the visitors were taken to the football game as guests of the local chapter.

That evening the Oklahoma Alummni gave a banquet in Oklahoma City at the Hammond Cafe in honor of the baby chapter.

An informal program was rendered with Clake J. Tisdel of Muskogee acting as toast master. Speeches were made by Dr. David R. Boyd, president of the Oklahoma University; Judge W. W. Hyams of Tulsa; Dr. E. E. Davis, of Oklahoma City; E. Ray Adams, of Tulsa and Frank Burford of Bartlesville, and others.

Foundation President's Report

Beta Theta Pi Foundation of Oklahoma, Inc. was incorporated in 2005. It is exempt from income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the IRS Code and all contributions to the Foundation are tax deductible. The purpose of the Foundation is to provide financial assistance in the form scholarships which may be awarded to recognize outstanding academic achievement and/or exemplary leadership or to address financial need.

Foundation goals include establishment of an endowed base for all scholarships. Presently, the Patrick James Frensley Memorial Scholarship is endowed, and both the Class of 1959 and the Class of 1961 have commenced efforts to endow scholarships in the names of their respective classes. However, whether contributing to a proposed endowed scholarship or not, every dollar is important, because general contributions will be used for "Gamma Phi Scholarships," as determined by the scholarship selection process. We also very much encourage non-Betas, such as parents, friends, surviving spouses and children and others to make contributions in honor of or in memory of a member of Gamma Phi. Think about it - the establishment of a permanent base of financial assistance for members and pledges of the Chapter will provide lasting mutual assistance to those who follow.




