Beta Theta Pi, the first college fraternity to be organized west of the Alleghenies, was also the first fraternity to adopt a truly national point of view. John Reily Knox and his associates founded the fraternity at Miami University, the first of the famous "Miami Triad." Today the brotherhood has expanded to 96 chapters.




Gamma Phi chapter, the second national fraternity established on the O. U. campus, was chartered in 1907 through the efforts of Dr. J. H. Felgar, past dean of the college of Engineering, and Dr. David Ross Boyd, first president of the University.

The I. F. C. scholarship trophy was permanently retired when the fraternity led all others on the campus for the spring semester of 1951. Jim Snow won acceptance to the Harvard Medical school and Richard Haynes was a candidate for the Rhodes Scholarship.

The 1951-52 Beta grid machine rolled to a 38-7 victory in the annual Beta-KA Beer Bowl classic. On the varsity grid, Beta was well represented by Merrill Green and Jim Davis, varsity tackle. Don Sobocinski carried off laurels from the cinder track.
